Government Relations Report – February 2022

RDAEF Administration of Local Anesthesia and Nitrous Oxide

This topic has been presented to the Dental Assisting Council and the Dental Board since 2018. It was brought back to the Dental Assisting Council at the November meeting for discussion and action. The Dental Assisting Council approved the appointment of Jeri Fowler and Tracy Reed-Espinoza to a work group to address this topic. They will discuss the specific issues to be studied, create relevant survey questions, and return to the Council with a list of the specific issues to be studied and survey questions.

At its January 2022 meeting, the Dental Assisting Council discussed the preliminary survey presented by the workgroup. The survey will first determine if there is interest and rationale for this and then they will gather qualitative data. proceeding
