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Course: Sit Back & Relax – Teaching Methodology for Provisionals

Course Description:

This course/topic will present a hybrid course teaching temporary provisional restorations. The course uses Canvas as the Learning Management System. An ehandout introduces the subject by presenting new information or reviewing information. The ehandout is supplemented with pictures and audio recordings to encompass various learning modalities. Students utilize laptops and headphones to view the previously recorded video instruction during the lab to fabricate the provisionals at their own pace.

Educational Objectives:

- 1. Apply online methods to facilitate student learning for fabricating temporary provisional restorations.
- 2. Compare and contrast available educational methods that can be applied to teaching temporary provisional restorations as a hybrid course.

Speaker Bio

Cara Miyasaki was the Program Director of the Foothill College Dental Assisting Program for over 32 years. She also cross-teaches in the Foothill College Dental Hygiene BSDH Program. She received her Certificate in Dental Assisting from Foothill College, a B.S. in Dental Hygiene and a M.S. in Oral Biology at the University of California, San Francisco School of Dentistry.
