A-Dental Adhesives:

- Generations of dental adhesives-components and how to use each
 - Etch
 - Primer
 - Adhesive-aka Bonding agent/Unfilled Resin
- What about the smear layer? (Major to understand)
 - Leave it or remove it- why or why not?
- o To etch or not to etch?
 - Total
 - Self
 - Selective

• **B**-Bands:

- o Tofflemire retainer and bands- assembly & supplemental lines of bands
- Sectionals- generations of these too-Palodent, Triodent, Garrison, Premier
- Retainerless- Automatrix, 360
- Wedges- wooden, plastic, anatomical, 'fins'- pros/cons
- Challenges- gingival retraction, margin elevation



- o Types- Flowable, Hybrid, Microfil, etc.-filler differences defined
- o Top Reasons for Post-Operative Sensitivity:
 - Over-etching dentin/ Over-drying dentin
 - Solvents not removed during drying step
 - Incomplete material coverage
 - Under-curing (importance of lights)
 - Polymerization shrinkage and stress (ALL composites shrink!)
- Flowables- NOT the same! SDR Flow +
- o Bulk-Fill discussion
- Shading advances
- Curing Light critical role
- Finishing/Polishing
 - o Many options, but necessary once occlusion is adjusted.
 - Fine Diamonds, white stones, abrasive points, cups, discs
 - 3M Polishing wheels- replace Sof-lex
 - Shofu Super-snap/Onegloss
 - Ivoclar Optragloss
 - DS Enhance/Pogo
 - Brasseler points
