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## Course: Faculty Calibration

## Course Description:

This course will explore strategies for consistent grading with faculty in both clinical and laboratory settings. Learn a variety of approaches to creating sensible grading policies. Review the details involved in creating rubrics that are clear and concise. Discuss varied techniques to calibrate faculty effectively.

## Course Objectives:

- 1. Review the process to create clear and concise grading rubrics.
- 2. Discuss and review the process of developing effective grading policies.
- 3. Compare and contrast various techniques to calibrate faculty grading procedures.

**Professor Cara Miyasaki, RDA, RDHEF, MS** is the Director Emeritus of the Foothill College Dental Assisting Program. She continues to teach part-time in the Dental Assisting and the Dental Hygiene program. Her areas of specialties include chairside assisting, dental materials, law & ethics, coronal polishing, sealants, and dental emergencies. Her publications include the Vital Signs and Medical History chapters of the textbook titled - Dental Hygiene Theory and Practice (Elsevier).

**Elizabeth Innes, CDA, RDA, BSDH**, has worked in the dental field for the past 18 years. She received her Certificate in Dental Assisting and worked as an RDA in a general and cosmetic practice. She later attended Foothill for her Associate's degree and Bachelor's degree in Dental Hygiene in 2020. For over a decade she worked with Tooth Fairy Systems as a lead instructor preparing dental assistants to pass the RDA exam and is a part-time dental assisting instructor at Foothill College.
